

## **Generosa Grana, M.D., F.A.C.P**

Dr. Generosa Grana is the Director of MD Anderson Cancer Center at Cooper.

She is Professor of Medicine at Cooper Medical School of Rowan University and serves as an Adjunct Professor of Cancer Medicine at The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center.

She was born in Galicia, Spain and moved to the United States with her parents at age 10.

After receiving a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Notre Dame, Dr. Grana attended medical school at the Northwestern University School of Medicine in Chicago before pursuing a residency in internal medicine at Temple University Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dr. Grana completed her fellowship in hematology and oncology at Fox Chase Cancer Center and Temple University in Philadelphia where she also completed a post-doctoral fellowship in preventive oncology.

Dr. Grana's clinical and research endeavors have focused on breast cancer, cancer genetics and community outreach interventions aimed at underserved populations and she continues to be very active in each of these areas. She has been active in clinical trials for breast cancer as well as in research focusing on the study of the hereditary aspects of breast, ovary, and colorectal cancer.

Dr. Grana has received numerous awards including the American Cancer Society Silver Chalice Award, the Susan G. Komen for the Cure "Light of Life" Award, the Delaware Valley's Most Influential Latinos Award and the Maria's Women United Public and Community Service Award. She has received proclamations from the Camden County Board of Freeholders for Hispanic Heritage Month and the New Jersey General Assembly for Women's History Month.

Dr. Grana has been distinguished as a "Top Doc" with *Philadelphia Magazine* annually from 2000-2016 and with *South Jersey Magazine* annually since 2003.
