## LEADERSHIP FROM WITHIN: CARE, CONNECT, CULTIVATE

Leadership is a recent focus for professional development of both early childhood directors and practitioners. In this keynote address, Dr. Zeynep Isik-Ercan will describe a framework for growing leadership abilities for caregivers and leaders in any early childhood context by caring for self, connecting with others and cultivating growth in people you work with.



### Keynote Presenter Bio

Dr. Zeynep Isik-Ercan is an Associate Professor of Early Childhood Education. She also co-leads Early Childhood Leadership Institute, an initiative to support the region's early childhood workforce in professional development and coaching. Previously, she served as an elementary education teacher, field coach for pre- and in-service early childhood teachers, liaison for university-early childhood center partnerships, and program director for a teacher preparation program in early childhood. Her research focuses on culturally and linguistically diverse children and families, best practices in curriculum and instruction of young children such as science and technology integration, and professional development of practitioners and leaders in the field of early childhood education. Her research regularly appears in national and international scholarly publications and conferences. She is the recipient of Wall of Fame award for teaching and advising from Rowan University (2017) and Hoosier Educator Award for Higher Education (2014) from Indiana Association for the Education of Young Children for her contribution to the growth of early childhood educators.
