## Protect from an Overdose

### DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO IS AT RISK FOR A HEROIN/OPIOID OVERDOSE?

The Overdose Prevention Act now allows doctors the ability to prescribe the opiate antidote Narcan® (naloxone) to those in a position to help someone else during an overdose of heroin or other opioids. The law also eliminates civil and criminal liability to anyone who administers naloxone.

**Free trainings** and education on how to administer naloxone to reverse a heroin/opioid overdose will be provided in Camden County. Participants who successfully complete the training will receive a **free naloxone kit**.

All trainings will be provided by credentialed addiction counselors and licensed nurses in a small, confidential setting to allow participants to receive "hands on" training. Trainings will be limited to 20 participants on a pre-registration basis and are open to the public.

- **Addiction education and treatment options**
- **Overdose prevention techniques**
- **Signs and symptoms of overdose**
- **Steps to take when an overdose occurs**
- **Rescue breathing**
- **How to administer naloxone, self-help, family support, and other important resource information**
