Our Department of Health & Human Services is designated as the **LINCS** Agency to serve Camden County. This is a statewide program that fosters interagency collaboration between Public Health and government officials via the **CHAIN**.

Camden County receives funding from the CDC for our Public Health Preparedness Grant. This enables us to provide LINCS region-wide strategic leadership and coordination to plan and respond to public health threats and emergencies, including natural disasters, disease outbreaks and acts of bioterrorism.

Our LINCS team consists of our County Health Officer, PHENS Coordinator, Epidemiologist, Health Educator/Risk Communicator, Partnership Coordinator, Registered Nurse/MRC Coordinator, State Planner, and Information Technology Specialist.

Programs include:

Disease Surveillance
Education & Training
Information Dissemination
Health Emergency Preparedness
Planning & Response

In addition, we will be involved in the assessment of training levels and the marketing of courses to meet the needs of the county's first responders and public health professionals.

LINCS Local Information Network and Communications System

An internet based electronic mail system that distributes information in the form of Public Health Alerts, Advisories, Updates and General Information.

The Information comes through the NJLINCS-HAN from agencies such as the CDC (Centers for Disease Control), the New Jersey Department of Homeland Security and Preparedness and the NJ Department of Health & Senior Services. The LINCS Coordinator forwards the information by email to appropriate CHAIN partners.

CHAIN Community Health Alert and Information Network

The **CHAIN** operates on a 24/7 basis which allows the CHAIN partners to receive the most accurate information in a timely manner via email and fax.
