The meeting was called to order by Director Louis Cappelli, Jr. at 7:00 p.m. The Director asked the Clerk to call the roll and the following Freeholders answered to their name:

Director Cappelli stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Director Cappelli asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance led by Connie Jackson and Ms. Jackson performed the National Anthem.

Director Cappelli announced that if requested, the County has large print agendas for the visually impaired. He said if you require large print, please see the Clerk.

Director Cappelli welcomed everyone. He said it our practice to hold the meetings throughout the year in different municipalities outside of our County seat of Camden. He said we are pleased to be here in our County seat of Camden and to be in this wonderful facility which is providing education to so many residents in the City of Camden.

Director Cappelli then recognized one of Camden Council members, Councilman Frank Moran. The Director then congratulated Freeholders Nash, Greco and Leonard, Sheriff Billingham and County Clerk Joe Ripa on their re-elections in November.

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH

Freeholder Cream welcomed everyone. Freeholder Cream said every month it is the Freeholder's responsibility to select from his/her department an employee and honor them. She said tonight happens to me my time. Freeholder Cream said it gives me great deal of pleasure to honor this young lady who has been with the Camden County Board of Chosen Freeholders for over 23 years. She called upon Tonja McNair-Hart to come forward. Freeholder Cream said we are also proud that we are calling her by her married name tonight. Her name is Hart now instead of McNair. The Freeholder said Tonja had a beautiful wedding. She said she was there and

the Freeholder congratulated her for that. Freeholder Cream also called upon Rob Mauriello and Dominic Vesper to come forward.

Freeholder Cream said Tonja resides in Pennsauken with her husband, Russell and her son. She is employed by the Camden County Department of Buildings & Operations and her office is located in City Hall. Freeholder Cream said Tonja has been employed by Camden County for over 23 years. She said since she has been a Freeholder in 1994 when Steve Yaroch was the head of the Department, she was here. Following Steve Yaroch, there was Chris Morris who became the Director; following Chris Morris came Joe Benton and remember Tonja is still here. We are very fortunate to have with us Rob Mauriello and Dominic Vesper, who helps us out a great deal in the Department. COMMUNITY AWARD

Freeholder Leonard welcomed everyone. Freeholder Leonard called upon Roger Barker and his wife to come forward. Freeholder Leonard said tonight I have the honor of giving the Proclamation to a gentleman who I can say as a Veteran, thank you very much. He said tonight we have someone who we don't have many left of in this country and that is a World War II Veteran. Freeholder Leonard said it gives me pleasure to give this award tonight because I live only a few blocks from here and as a resident of the City of Camden, it is an honor to give to another resident in the City of Camden. Freeholder Leonard said Mr. Barker is a resident of the Liberty Park section of Camden but he is also something else that a lot of people don't know - he is the founder of the Liberty Park Neighborhood Association. The Freeholder said for people who know, it is a very active neighborhood association here in Camden City. The Freeholder said now I found out why; it is because of the efforts of Mr. Barker. Not only because of the day to day work that he does but he is the founder of Liberty Park Neighborhood Association. He is man when you ask him to do something, he does it and comes back and says what's next. It is not the next day it is usually a couple of hours later. Freeholder Leonard said it is very rare to find that today - someone who takes such pride in our neighborhood no matter where you live. He takes pride in the neighborhood and what you do and what the neighborhood association does - not many people take the time but this is a man who makes time no matter what he is doing and gets the residents involved as much as he can. The Director announced that the meeting is now open to the public for any topic the public would like to bring before the Board.

Charlie McClain of Camden addressed the Freeholder Board. Mr. McClain said my issue with the Freeholders tonight is to discuss the cleaning up of Camden City and the Camden streets. Mr. McClain distributed pictures to the Freeholders. Mr. McClain said the County owns a lot of the streets in the City of Camden and I am here tonight to ask that they need to be maintained clean. He said they are falling apart and referred to the pictures. He said he is not sure if the Freeholders are responsible for the fixing of the streets but the cleanliness should also be addressed. Mr. McClain said as a member of Camden United he and others members have sent in complaints for the condition of the streets for over a year. He said he discussed it with Councilwoman Dana Burley. He said it has been over a year and he would like the Freeholders to get him some answers. Director Cappelli said some of the streets look like they are County roads and others are City roads. Mr. McClain said he checked and the pictures are all County roads. The Director said we will take a look at these and see what we can do.

Director Cappelli said we have already scheduled a meeting with Mayor-elect Redd to talk about ways that the County and City can work closely together to improve some of the basic quality of life issues and basic government services provided by the City. The Director said I am really excited about the potential for a lot more cooperation and good work in the future. He said we will definitely look at these roads. The Director asked for Mr. McClain's phone number and said he will contact him. Freeholder Leonard interjected and said that Frank Moran, Director of Public Works Department, will also speak with Mr. McClain after the meeting.

Mr. McClain then said one road that the County definitely fixed about a year and a half ago, River Road, it is all falling apart. He said it was taken up and repaired down to the ground - now it is crumbling and cracking. The Director said he will

have someone come out to look at that. Mr. McClain thanked the Freeholders for their help.

Seeing no other members from the public wishing to speak, Director Cappelli asked for a motion to close the public portion. Deputy Director McDonnell made a motion to close the public portion with a second by Freeholder Greco and all Freeholders present voted aye.

Director Cappelli then called upon the Freeholders for their comments.

Freeholder Cream said it is always a pleasure to come back and have the meeting in my hometown, Camden, the place where I was born. She said she is very happy that the Freeholders continue to understand that bringing the meeting to the residents of Camden City is very important. She thanked them again for remembering to do that. Freeholder Cream also expressed her thanks and appreciation and compliments to our newly elected Freeholders, Ian Leonard, who also lives in Camden; and to Freeholder Greco and Freeholder Nash. We congratulate you and hope that you will be here another 15 years! Freeholder Cream said she wanted Mayor Faison to know that she has appreciated her service to the citizens of Camden for the many years that she has been the Mayor here. Freeholder Cream said I also want to congratulate my former aide, Dana Redd, who has been the newly elected Mayor of this City. She said all of us are hoping with her presence, we will see many wonderful things happen in the years to come. Thank you, Director.

Freeholder Leonard thanked Gino Lewis and his staff and the Office of Community Development. The Freeholder said he had an opportunity to speak to an organization that helps with homeless prevention, energy assistance and transitioning homeless individuals. He said the key thing that is happening now is a lot of people are losing their homes and Gino and his staff put a terrific program together the other day.

Freeholder Rodriguez thanked everyone here tonight. She said Camden City is a place where I grew up, where I studied and went to school and where I work right now. She said for me, Camden City is home and it is always a pleasure to be home. She said I do know these roads quite well - I take them all the time. She said she is here on a daily basis. Freeholder Rodriguez congratulated Freeholders Nash, Greco and Leonard and also Sheriff Billingham and Clerk Joe Ripa for their outstanding victory as well as all of our local officials who recently got elected. She said I would like to congratulate all of them for their hard work.

Freeholder Rodriguez then said I would like to give special thanks to the people in the Health Department, who have been working very hard to coordinate all our efforts vaccinating at-

risk individuals within our community. Vaccines have been limited - we have gone out and reached those people who are at-risk. She said the job they have performed in bringing everyone to the table, coordinating a program that is structured based on need is amazingly wonderful. It has been very well run. She said she has been to the facilities and to the sites and the people thank the Freeholders and the Health Department for just running such a smooth operation. She said she has heard that many other counties just don't compare to the fantastic work that our Health Department has done. She congratulated all the individuals who have worked so hard to make this possible. She said it has been so challenging and you all have done an outstanding job. Freeholder Greco said he would like to share with everyone that everyday he hears good stories about what's going on in Camden City. She works with children at the Whittier School and she is very proud and happy to be a part of the Camden City family. He said I thank you for allowing her to be a teacher here in the City. He congratulated all the local officials who won the election and his fellow Freeholders. He said we look forward to working together with the new Mayor of the City of Camden and doing wonderful things for the City of Camden. Thank you.

Deputy Director McDonnell thanked everyone for being here and also said he would like to join in congratulated Freeholders Greco and Nash on their re-election and especially want to acknowledge Ian Leonard who in the short time he has been on this Board has proven to me and to all of us that he is going to be a spectacular addition to this Board. Congratulations, Ian. He wished everyone a good evening.

Director Cappelli thanked everyone at Camden County College for hosting the meeting this evening. He said they do so graciously every November. He thanked the employees of Camden County for the hard work they do day in and day out on behalf of the residents of Camden County.
