## HADDON LAKE PARK

Haddon Lake Park is a 73 acre park located in Haddon Heights, Audubon and Mount Ephraim. The park runs from Station Avenue to 10th Avenue and from Kings Highway to the Black Horse Pike. The adjacent Haddon Lake, once a swamp, was built along with the park by the Works Progress Administration and Civilian Conservation Corps as part of the New Deal in the 1930s.

Settled in a dense suburban area, this park is inviting for the whole family with its multiple athletic courts, fields, playgrounds, and picnic areas. Also nestled in this quaint park is the Norcross-McLaughlin Dell which offers free concerts and other entertainment events sponsored by the Camden County Board of Freeholders throughout the summer.

The 1.6 mile cross country trail is great for spotting a variety of birds throughout all seasons. The nearby lake is popular for fishing with an accessible boat ramp and fishing pier. The park also includes a bike path that starts at Station Avenue and finishes in Mt. Ephraim.
