

## **NEWTON LAKE PARK**

Newton Lake Park is a 103 acre park that runs through Collingswood, Oaklyn and Haddon Township and is bounded by Cuthbert Boulevard and the White Horse Pike. The park is filled with amenities for individuals of all ages, such as paved trails for biking, hiking or running, three picnic areas, and playgrounds. The southeastern corner contains a ten-acre area of old growth forest, known as Lee's Lane Woods. The park is a great place to spot waterfowl and other birds. Fishing is also popular along the piers or on the water (small car top boat launch at U.S. Route 30 and Newton Lake Drive parking lot). Kayaking or canoeing can be a great way to explore the lake from an alternative perspective.
