

## Refugees and Migration Lecture Series

We are pleased to offer a five-lecture series on *Refugees and Migration*, September – October, 2017. The lecture series is cosponsored by the American Research Institute in Turkey, the University of Pennsylvania Middle East Center, and hosted by The Center @ Camden County College. The series will provide professional education credits to teachers in NJ and PA.

- **September 11 - 1177 B.C.: The Year Civilization Collapsed**

Eric Cline, Professor Cline looks at the conditions that brought down the flourishing peoples and cultures of the late Bronze Age in the Mediterranean, a globalized world that in the end was vulnerable to catastrophic changes. Eric Cline is Professor of Classics and Anthropology and Director of the George Washington University Capitol Archaeological Institute.

- **September 25 - Displacement and Forced Migration of Syrians and Iraqis: Cultural Impacts in the Middle East and Beyond.**

Dr. Al-Kuntar considers cultural heritage as a human right that defines who we are, our cultures and the multilayered identities that we carry as people, especially in the Middle East – the contested heritage, our affinity to the region, and the different ethnic groups, religions, and stories of humankind. Dr. Salam Al-Kuntar is a visiting assistant professor in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Pennsylvania.

- **October 2 - Displacement and Migration in the Eastern Mediterranean during the 19th/20th century.** Professor Gratien examines why the history of the Ottoman Empire is critical to understanding the history of global migration and politics surrounding immigration and refugees in the US, Europe, and beyond. Professor Gratien is an Academy Scholar, Harvard Academy for International and Area Studies and Professor in the Corcoran Department of History, University of Virginia.

- **October 16 - International and US Refugee Law and Policy.**

Professor Muy will provide an overview of immigrant and refugee law and policy. Fernando Chang-Muy is the Thomas O'Boyle Lecturer in Law at the University of Pennsylvania School of Law, where he teaches Refugee Law and Policy.

- **October 30 - Fleeing Inquisition: European Refugees in 18th Century Istanbul.**

Professor Küçük examines how scholars, craftsmen, and prisoners of war integrated themselves into urban life in Istanbul during the time of the Ottoman Empire. Harun Küçük, Assistant Professor, History and Sociology of Science, University of Pennsylvania.
