The meeting was called to order by Director Cappelli at 12:00 p.m.

The Clerk called the roll and the following Freeholders answered:

The Director stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

The Director asked everyone to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance which was led by Freeholder Kane and the National Anthem which was sung by Kate Bove, a 6<sup>th</sup> grader at Rosa International Middle School.

The Director thanked everyone and asked for a round of applause.

Director Cappelli said the County has large print agendas available from the Clerk for the visually impaired.

The Director welcomed everyone to the meeting of the Camden County Board of Freeholders and recognized Cherry Hill Council President Sara Lipsett and Councilwoman Carolyn Jacobs.

## **PRESENTATION**

Director Cappelli said, as we go from town to town and have our meetings, we ask the governing body for the name of a non-profit in town worthy of a small donation and recognition by the Board of Freeholders. This governing body has chosen Cherry Hill African American Civic Association. The Director asked Tina Truitt to come forward. The Cherry Hill African American Civic Association, formerly the Cherry Hill Minority Civic Association, was organized in 1978 by a concerned group of African American residents. This group has been recognized by Cherry Hill Township, Cherry Hill Board of Education and the New Jersey General Assembly and was built upon three pillars: unity, service and purpose. Part of the organization's mission is to provide a vehicle for the participation of African American residents in Cherry Hill in the community life and

a collective voice for residents to exercise their rights and responsibilities as citizens. Director Cappelli said, Ms. Truitt, on behalf of the Board of Chosen Freeholders we thank you for all that you do.

Ms. Truitt thanked everyone and said this is a great honor. Councilwoman Jacobs said one of the other things that the African American Civic Association does is provide scholarships. They raise money and give scholarships to very deserving individuals going on to secondary education.

# **COMMUNITY AWARD**

Freeholder Kane asked Sara Lipsett, Janet Hung, Kareem Agostini and Jen Fleisher to come forward. Freeholder Kane said, as a resident of Cherry Hill for almost 30 years and someone who has had three sons educated within the schools, I know that it takes a village to not just educate our children, but to make them fine citizens, so I thank you on behalf of parents everywhere. It is the desire of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Camden to recognize community groups that strive to ensure a quality education for our children. The Cherry Hill Zone PTA promotes community spirit and the exchange of ideas for the betterment of all Cherry Hill Public School children. The PTA Presidents from each of the township's 19 schools convene with the District's Administration and community for a joint meeting held every month. The Cherry Hill PTA Presidents and the District's Administration collaborate throughout the year to enhance the educational experience throughout the district. The Zone PTA maintains social media pages to keep the community informed of all the great accomplishments, events and other news happening in Cherry Hill schools. On behalf of the Board we acknowledge Cherry Hill Zone PTA and urge the citizens of the County of Camden to applaud the efforts of this worthy organization.

Jen Fleisher thanked the Freeholders, on behalf of the Zone PTA, and said it is a very big honor for us to be honored by the entire County. We work very hard to be a voice of our students in the Township so this is a very big honor for us.

# **CORRESPONDENCE**

The Director asked the Clerk if there was any correspondence. The Clerk responded that no, Director, there is not.

The Director said the next portion of the meeting is open to the public for discussion of resolutions to be acted upon. There will be another public hearing later in the meeting at which members of the public can ask any questions they want regarding the business of Camden County. This portion is limited to the discussion of those resolutions to be acted upon.

The Director opened the public hearing.

<u>Sara Joslin, Cherry Hill</u>. Ms. Joslin said I have comments and questions regarding several Resolutions. Resolution #3, the funds for preliminary architectural and engineering design services of the Walter Rand Transportation Center, is this including the facilities needed for the electric busses that will be placed in service in Camden using the proposed funds from Volkswagen? There is infrastructure that is required for those busses and, Ms. Joslin said, I would like to know whether the citing is in this resolution or is elsewhere because, of course, we do not want to have any interaction between electrical and water. Director Cappelli responded that this resolution is simply for planning funds and asked if they are New Jersey Transit busses? Ms. Joslin responded, yes they are. They are electrical. Director Cappelli said, again, this is just preliminary funding. Ms. Joslin said I am just mentioning that this is a significant infrastructure and the specific design of the busses so that is an important design criteria to consider. If this is the place for that to be done it should be considered here. If it going to be elsewhere, it should be considered somewhere else.

Resolution #30 which is agreement between the County of Camden and the Parking Authority of Camden City, relative to the management of parking lot 6. Ms. Joslin said I wonder if this resolution included any relationship to the proposed cost of storm water runoff. I am not sure of the status of that legislation relative to the County or Camden City. There is a proposal for a tax for storm water runoff on parking lots to account for the combined sewer fees. Director Cappelli said it does not; this is only a management agreement.

Resolution #41 about the signage for a trail that is to be placed at Cooper River Park. Ms. Joslin said she respectfully submits that the title should actually be Born Learning Trail because this is a series of Born Learning Trails. This just happens to be the Born Learning Trail at Cooper River Park. Maggie McCann said that has been corrected.

The Director said seeing no members of the public wishing to comment, he asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Freeholder Nash made the motion with a second by Freeholder Rodriguez and all Freeholders present voted aye.

The Director closed the public hearing.

## **RESOLUTION 116**

## **NO MOTION MADE – FAILED**

Director Cappelli opened the meeting to any member of the public who wished to address the Board of Freeholders. The Director declared the hearing open.

Ann Einhorn, Cherry Hill. Ms. Einhorn said, I am coming to you to ask for funding for security for the public schools in Camden County, New Jersey. Burlington County Board of Freeholders last year allotted \$20 million dollars to support school security and infrastructure improvements to protect our children. They took \$20 million dollars out of their budget. We have 6,000 more taxpayers in this County to help support this. We also receive 5% funding from pilot programs in this County. Somewhere, some how I would hope that you would consider finding funding to at least support the high schools and if they are sufficient, then at least support the middle schools. We are struggling in Cherry Hill, New Jersey. Our infrastructure is poor, our budget is tighter than yours and we serve a lot of children. The award that was given today, Zone PTA does a lot. We all do a lot. I am begging you to find a way to help take care of children in Cherry Hill and the rest of the County. We have 31 schools that are involved. Burlington County had 20. We have more taxpayers that can get involved in this and I am sure would be willing to support it. Ms. Einhorn said I would sincerely hope you are willing to support it. I think it would be an honorable thing considering all of the other wonderful things the County does.

Sara Joslin, Cherry Hill. Ms. Joslin said I want to comment on the issue of climate resilience. Of course, this meeting was delayed because we had an extreme amount of flooding that occurred last week. I wanted to talk about the issue of climate resilience and in particular the plans that are going on for emergency response. About a month ago the EPA, Region 3 and Emergency Planning had a trial, a practice drill in Philadelphia for flooding. We didn't have that practice drill. We had the real thing. They had the real thing. I am asking about the readiness that we have to deal with flooding. I don't know the details. The coverage was primarily Rancocas Creek and Westville, although I did see a picture about the Park Drive along Cooper River being completely covered with water. I urge you to consider the issue of climate resilience and the importance of design and planning in Camden and, of course, the Cooper River Watershed as far as not allowing increases in the amount of coverage. I noticed that the golf course in Voorhees, which I know you don't have responsibility for, but it was proposed to take that space and cover it with 95% impermeable space. That is an example of the lack of coordination over coverage. I don't know if that resolution passed or not but that was presented to their Planning Board about two weeks ago. From a climate resiliency point of view, of course we have our trails that we are putting in Camden County will kind of circle Camden City itself. It is really important in the design of the trails for us to consider the runoff and to avoid the issues of damage to the trails. I don't know the degree of flooding or damage that did occur because of the rain to the trail systems, the road systems or other infrastructures in the City. Climate resilience is an extremely important thing. In Camden City itself there is a requirement, a sustainability ordinance, that all improvements, that would be new buildings or modifications, consider the environmental impact. That would seem like that would be something to encourage County-wide where we have a major watershed here. I mention this because my house backs up to the north branch of Cooper River. There are many other people in the same place. I am sure there are other people that had water damage that occurred regardless of where they were located in the County. Climate issues are increasing, not decreasing. The frequency of storms is increasing and it is certainly something we need to get ahead of. As you know, portions of Camden City are in the wave zone. That is not only dealing with the fact that we are going to have over 100 degrees in parts of Europe and increase melting temperatures of northern glaciers that are going to be occurring this summer. That was the issue. I am hoping that there will be a robust training of emergency response for people such as homeless people, such as people who are isolated in their homes because they are elderly people who can't be tended to by their families because of inability to travel. Those kinds of awareness things are important and it does fall upon our emergency response people to understand that. Ms. Joslin said, I did not experience a power outage and I don't know how many people did, but we know that there have been power outages in Camden and elsewhere. In fact, on my own block we had a four-day power outage after a storm a couple of years ago. People who are requiring oxygen, who are requiring situations where they have medical care need to be accounted for and understood that there is care being provided. I myself, living in Cherry Hill, have the opportunity to be forced to give up my copper land line. Since I don't have a cell phone, that takes away my ability to call people in the event of an emergency. I want to make sure that you understand that 5% of people don't have cell phones and are relying upon emergency response or neighbors in the event of an emergency. It is important criteria for emergency planning and in particular as we go through issues of climate resiliency.

Freeholder Nash asked Ms. Joslin for her contact information.

Director Cappelli said he wanted to commend our emergency response folks. During the flooding, they did a tremendous job in those communities that had some problems in assisting businesses and assisting residents from the Command Center in Cherry Hill. Thankfully there were no injuries, as far as we know. There was some property damage but when you have 5" of rain in a few short hours, it is to be expected. There are areas of the County that do flood. Thankfully, Governor Murphy was talking about maybe making some infrastructure improvements and changes to help alleviate some of this flooding in the future.

Seeing no members of the public wishing to comment, Director Cappelli asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Freeholder Nash made a motion with a second by Freeholder Rodriguez and all Freeholders voted aye.

The Director opened the floor to the members of the Board of Freeholders for their comments.

Freeholder Nash wished everyone a good day.

Freeholder Rodriguez wished everyone a happy and safe summer.

**Freeholder Shin Angulo** said safety is paramount through this County. Make sure if there is construction out on the roads that you give yourself extra time. She thanked Council Vice President Sara Lipsett and Councilwoman Carolyn Jacobs for joining us. Happy 4<sup>th</sup> of July to everyone.

**Freeholder Kane** thanked everyone for coming out today and said your input is very welcomed. In addition, she thanked everyone in our municipalities who worked together to make sure that everyone was as safe as possible, not just during the storm on Wednesday night and Thursday but on the days prior when we had a tremendous amount of rain. A little teaser alert, coming out on July 1<sup>st</sup> will be an announcement for an event that the County will be holding. Finally, she wished everyone a happy and safe 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

**Director Cappelli** thanked the employees of Camden County for the hard work they do day in and day out on behalf of our residents.

The Director asked for a motion to adjourn. Freeholder Shin Angulo made a motion with a second by Freeholder Rodriguez and all Freeholders voted aye.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 p.m.
