Work Completed Week of April 29, 2019

- Maintenance and Protection of Traffic (MPT) placed at construction site
- Demolition and replacement of concrete curb ramps, and pavement restoration on the South side of intersection of Station Avenue and West Atlantic Avenue

Quantities Week of April 29, 2019

- **Item #1:** Breakaway Barricade (1 UN)
- **Item #3:** Traffic Cone (20 UN)
- **Item #4:** Construction Signs (72 SF)
- **Item #7:** Pavement Restoration (61.3 SY)
- **Item #8:** 9" x 18" Concrete Vertical Curb (33 LF)
- **Item #9:** Concrete Sidewalk, 4" Thick (13 SY)
- **Item #10:** Public Sidewalk Curb Ramp Detectable Warnings, Brick Truncated Domes (24 SF)
- **Item #14:** Police Traffic Directors (32 MH)

Summary of Work Completed Week of April 29, 2019

Charles Marandino LLC, (Marandino) started work on the South side of the intersection of Station Avenue and West Atlantic Avenue. Three existing curb ramps were demolished, and new curb ramps were reconstructed. The pavement around the radius of the ramps was replaced with an approximate 8' width. Maintenance and Protection of Traffic (MPT) is set up before each work day and taken down at the end of each work shift. Police Uniform Law Enforcement Officers are additionally utilized for traffic control.

Anticipated Work for Week of May 20, 2019

Marandino will continue with demolition and replacement of concrete curb ramps on the North side of intersection of Station Avenue and West Atlantic Avenue, by the railroad tracks. The pavement surrounding the curb ramps will be restored as part of the curb ramp reconstruction. Daily traffic control will continue to be implemented for the duration of the project.
