A GATEWAY to TREATMENT

Project SAVE is a program that was launched by the Camden County Board of Commissioners and the Camden County Addiction Awareness Task Force in 2019, to continue to fight against the disease of addiction.

Municipalities, all over Camden County, joined the effort by placing Certified Drug and Alcohol Counselors in the Municipal Courts to assist in offering defendants the opportunity of treatment and resources for recovery. This collaboration bridges the gap between those arrested for substance use-related or substance-induced charges and treatment services.

In 2023, Camden County expanded Project SAVE by incorporating Mental Health Navigators. The MH Navigator is designed to help defendants who are living with a mental illness and facing criminal charges that may stem from the mental health disorder. MH Navigators are trained in navigating the mental health systems of care, connecting individuals to the most appropriate service, and effective follow-up.

Project SAVE Advocates and MH Navigators will work in coordination with the Municipal Courts and Prosecutors to connect defendants with a substance use disorder and/ or living with a mental illness to the appropriate treatment options and available resources.

Project SAVE and the MH Navigator services are voluntary.
