## CHALLENGE GROVE PARK

Challenge Grove Park is an 18 acre park located adjacent to Wallworth Lake and Evans Pond in Cherry Hill Township. Established in 1995, this park has numerous amenities for individuals of all ages, especially children. Challenge Grove includes Jake's Place Playground, a fully accessible playground for children

with disabilities, and Boundless Field, a 13,000 square foot handicap accessible field for baseball and other organized sports. With other amenities such as the basketball court, bocce ball court, track, and pavilion with restrooms, this park is a great place to bring the whole family for a day out.

Across from Challenge Grove is the historic eighteenth century Croft Farmstead which has a network of six trails that wind through different natural habitats including meadows, scrub-shrub, early successional forest and mature forest.
