**Work Completed Week of May 2, 2020**

- Cherry Hill Township's contractor Techna-Pro removed existing pedestrian signal poles and junction box
- Diehl Electric ran wire for traffic control devices
- Surveyors laid out center islands along Chapel Avenue

### **Summary of Work Completed Week of May 2, 2020**

Lexa Concrete (Lexa) only had subcontractors onsite performing work this week. Cherry Hill Township's contractor Techna-Pro was onsite to remove the existing pedestrian signal poles and junction box. Lexa's subcontractor Diehl Electric began running wire for traffic control devices at the intersection with Towers of Windsor Drive. Lexa's surveyors continued to layout center islands. Techna-Pro had Maintenance and Protection of Traffic (MPT) set up before each work day and taken down at the end of each work shift. Uniformed Law Enforcement Officers are additionally utilized for traffic control. The project will continue as planned despite the current pandemic.

### **Anticipated Work for Week of May 9, 2020**

Lexa will continue with the removal and replacement of concrete curb, sidewalk, driveways, and curb ramps as specified in the plans along Chapel Avenue. Daily traffic control will continue to be implemented for the duration of the project. A progress meeting via teleconference will be held on April 27, 2020 to review all project related activities.
