CAMDEN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MEETING

The meeting was called to order by Director Cappelli at 12:00 p.m.

The Clerk called the roll and the following Commissioners answered:

The Director stated that adequate notice of this meeting has been provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

The Director asked everyone to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance which was led by Commissioner Young.

The Director said good afternoon ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the meeting of the Camden County Board of Commissioners. The Director said this afternoon will be begin our meeting by recognizing a few individuals who played a big role in saving a life in one of our County libraries. Director Cappelli asked Commissioner Betteridge, Commissioner Kane, Dominic Vesper, Addiction Awareness Task Force representative and Linda Devlin to join him. The Director said, as many of you know the Camden County Addiction Awareness Task Force reports to our Board monthly and plays a big role in fighting the opioid addiction crisis here in Camden County. They suggested a policy a few months ago that each of our buildings, and now each of our schools in Camden County, carry Narcan kits to reverse overdoses. Our employees have been trained on the use of it and low and behold a situation took place in one of our libraries recently and thanks to the fact that we had Narcan in the library, several folks, who we are about to recognize, were familiar with how to use it. These individuals actually saved a life.

Before we call them up, I would like to invite Linda Devlin to say a few words. Ms. Devlin said first I would like to thank the Board of Commissioners for their support of the library and their support of having Narcan available to library patrons and library staff and supporting us in having the library staff trained to know how to administer it. Because of that support we were able to, through one of our staff members at our Nilsa Cruz-Perez Downtown Branch, save a life and reverse an opioid overdose. I am very proud of our staff who work with the public on a daily basis and are able to help in such profound ways.

Director Cappelli invited Commissioner Kane to say a few words. Commissioner Kane said I want to thank Linda and her staff and everyone who was present that day and every day. Linda, I think you had sent me an article about libraries being second responders in our community. So many things happen within our branches that people are not aware of and very often for residents the support that they need comes from the library staff. Thank you for your awareness, your alertness, and your compassion.

Director Cappelli invited Commissioner Betteridge to say a few words. Commissioner Betteridge said good afternoon everyone. What a moment to be present today. A few months ago, the Director, myself and some of our fellow Commissioners got behind the delivery of Narcan throughout Camden County. When I sat there that day and I heard and I learned what was happening in our County I knew that we could make a difference. Here today we stand because of the diligence of so many that were working that day at the library and the caring nature of seeing someone in distress that we are able to come here together today and celebrate a life. If we can continue to do this on a daily basis, what a wonderful County we will live in and what a difference we are making in New Jersey.

Director Cappelli said this also involved Rutgers Police and invited Chief Kevin Lutz to say a few words. Chief Lutz said when we were approached about the Narcan boxes that were to be placed at Rutgers University it was something that as a police department and a representative of public safety we strongly supported within the Administration of Rutgers-Camden. We are proud to be here and proud to recognize the officers and security staff within the public safety division at Rutgers. We are very fortunate to have the backing of the County Commissioners to fund such an important program.

Director Cappelli asked Dominic Vesper to say a few words about the efforts of the Camden County Addiction Awareness Task Force. Mr. Vesper said as a fellow public servant I am very proud of you. Camden County, if not the first, is one of the first to use their opioid settlement funds and that is how these Narcan and Naloxone boxes were purchased for all the school and libraries. It makes me very proud that we received the support of the Commissioners and used our settlement funds for such a good purpose.

Thank you to my amazing co-workers who might be watching on Zoom. They are covering the branch so I could be here. Thank you to our wonderful colleagues at Rutgers. I think this could have gone differently if they were not there that day. My wife and I had a baby about nine months ago and when something like this happens I think about how this individual was once someone's tiny baby. It was a really a sad situation and I hope he is doing ok.

Director Cappelli opened the meeting to any member of the public who wished to address the Board of Commissioners.

Seeing no members of the public wishing to comment, Director Cappelli asked for a motion to close the public hearing. Deputy Director McDonnell made a motion with a second by Commissioner Kane and all Commissioners voted ave.

The Director opened the floor to the members of the Board of Commissioners for their comments.

Commissioner Kane said I want to again thank the staff of the Camden County Library, particularly Julie Tozer, the Librarian, Security Officers Rodriguez and Henriquez, Police Officer Mancuso and Sgt. Slifko. What they did was heroic and made a difference in saving a life. It is representative of what goes on every day in the awareness of the staff and the caring hearts making sure that not only are residents finding what they are looking for but also using the computers and finding a safe place to go for whatever their needs are. The staff is always welcoming and supportive of the residents who use our libraries. This month they have also done a lot of programs within the library system including Black History Month, Take Your Child to the Library Day on February 4th and offering tax preparation. We also have three new appointees to the Library Board, and I would like to congratulate Charlene Burd, Earl Davis and Debra Kendall for joining our Library Commission.

On March 12th the Veterans Affairs Office in conjunction with community partners will be hosting a Suicide Awareness Program at Camden County College and I encourage all our residents who are either veterans or family members of veterans to consider attending this event which will also be available online.

Commissioner Kane said, finally, I would like to congratulate Commissioner Dyer on his success with the basketball tournament. Commissioner Betteridge and I attended a game the other day. We had a wonderful time and could see the hard work and sweat that went into playing the game and planning the tournament.

Commissioner Nash said I wanted to take a moment to thank the members of the Parks Department. As you know, last year at about this time we announced the Parks Alive initiative which was a major initiative to revamp all the parks. I will say that Maggie and Dominic and the team at the Parks Department that includes Scott, Anthony, Ashley, Maureen, Joan, Jack Sworaski, Brian Costantino, Lauren with help from Frank Filipek, Jr., Dan Keashen and many, many others have done an amazing job. There are 60 projects that are in motion at different levels of preparation, and we are starting to see the fruits of those labors. The other night Deputy Director McDonnell and I went to a public hearing that was conducted by the Parks Department to talk about the possible construction of Jake's Place in Winslow at the New Brooklyn Park. It is a project that we hope to dedicate to the late Mayor Barry Wright because that had been his passion for many, many years. The Mayor attended as did most of the council members. Maggie did a great job with the presentation and it was just such a warm wonderful feeling that the Parks Department in Camden County can bring that type of accessibility for the young children in our community especially with the success of the one in Cherry Hill and now matched by one in Winslow. It was great. There are so many other projects which are ongoing. We have meetings all the time and many public hearings. Dominic Andujar Park is under construction as we speak. The Gateway Lighting Project and passive recreation is ongoing. The improvements to Cooper River Park continue. We had a public hearing on a potential skateboard park that was attended by over 100 young people and we are working with municipalities to see if we can bring that to somewhere in our community. Berlin Park is ongoing. The pickle ball courts are packed, and we are adding lighting there. We are working on a water trail and the marina is going to be revamped. We have a brand-new website that is going to create a full comprehensive parks plan, to include municipal, county and state parks. It is a work in motion. I am really proud of the works of the Parks Department and of the people who do this day to day and I wanted to recognize them.

Director Cappelli said thank you to all the Parks Department employees for their great work and thank you Jeff for your leadership on all those issues related to the parks.

Commissioner Young said the GED Program has been replaced by the HiSET. Testing has begun at the One Stop in Cherry Hill. To register go to hiset.org. On March 3^{rd} from 11-2 at the Cherry Hill Mall the One Stop has its Spring Job Fair. Since we moved to Woodcrest, the One Stop's foot traffic has greatly increased. At Homeward Bound there are dozens of cats and dogs in the shelter waiting to find a loving and forever home. On February $24^{th}-26^{th}$ all adoption fees are waived for that weekend.

The Office of Sustainability is welcoming 25 new certified gardeners to the program. The Certified Gardner's Program has greatly improved since the County brought the program in-house. Our Annual Plant Sale is Saturday May 6th. Beginning tomorrow through Monday we have something called the Great Backyard Bird Count. You go out in your backyard and count all the birds that you see and then go to camdencounty.com and let us know how many birds you counted. This bird count is going on all over the country. We have done something very special at the Sustainability Building to help protect the birds. We have made our windows bird friendly. The

windows have invisible spots that only the birds can see, and they do not fly into the windows.

Commissioner Dyer said I want to thank the County workforce for the great job they do every day, as well as the leadership at the Department of Public Works. Recently we discussed, as per their leadership, spotlighting individuals at DPW that come in every day and do a fantastic job. This month we selected Wesley Walls. Wesley started with the Highway Department in July of 2022. He has fantastic attendance. He smiles every day and loves his job. He is always willing to learn something. He was just promoted to truck driver and is a great addition to Bob's staff. His attitude and the way he goes about doing things is infectious and a lot of people at DPW see that and try to do the same thing he does. Congratulations Wesley Walls.

Several months ago, I was asked to be on a committee to help form the Inaugural Camden County Basketball Tournament. Most counties have a tournament, but Camden County did not. The tournament is meant to prepare players for the State playoffs which start in a couple of weeks. Tonight is the Tournament Championship Game and the East Side Tigers will play the Camden High Panthers at 6 PM at Cherry Hill East. I'm very excited because we worked very hard to get this started. Every school in Camden County that is in a conference gets a template of 18 to 20 games. We had to try to infuse 6 possible games into their schedule so we could have this tournament. It worked out well. I will be thanking the Committee tonight for the great job they did in putting this together with us. They would like the County to be more involved next year with maybe a proclamation for each player or an MVP award or something like that.

Commissioner Betteridge said the Health and Human Services Department has been extremely busy over the past several months even prior to me joining the Board in July. I quickly learned that we have some instrumental employees, directors, and leaders in both arenas in the Health and Human Services and directly with the Health Department that have been able to mold programs and bring new programs with some of the opioid settlement funds that we mentioned today. One of the programs that I am totally elated to talk about today and I know Dominic Vesper had a tremendous role in this with the Addiction Awareness Task Force, is that we are putting out an RFP through the Department of Health and Human Services and on behalf of the Addiction Awareness Task Force for the provision of Substance Misuse Services in the amount of \$597,000. That is a remarkable amount of money to bring into our County to help those that need help with substance abuse and other addictions that are hurting our community. The other resolution that is near and dear to me is the Professional Consulting Services relative to establishing a Mental Health Urgent Care Facility in Camden County. In the past six or seven months that I have sat at this dais the number of families I have spoken to and the tragic stories that are brought to my attention, I just don't have the words to express my gratitude to this Board for making sure we have an institution in Camden County that is going to serve one of our most vulnerable populations and people who are in need of mental health services. Seeing this resolution today is just very near and dear to my heart and I speak on behalf of the constituents who have come to me personally and brought their personal stories and I know they are very happy that there will be some mechanism out there where they can bring their family and loved ones.

With respect to the Board of Social Services, our move to Cherry Hill has been tremendously successful. I was able to attend my first meeting there yesterday and what a pleasure it was to be there and see the employees come together to help so many in Camden County. One of the statistics that was brought to my attention is that while we have always done a stellar job,

moving the Board of Social Services to Cherry Hill has now given the opportunity for suburbia here in Camden County to access the programs. Our numbers are going up and the clients are treated with dignity and respect in a clean and safe environment and our employees are the beneficiaries of a state-of-the-art facility. I sincerely appreciate the dedication and the funds you put forth to make sure our most vulnerable are being treated with respect and dignity and that institution in Woodcrest is an example of the good job that we are doing here on this Board.

At the Board of Social Services, under the leadership of our Chairman, Jim Rhodes, we have conversations about how we can bring our programs to the people right in their communities. We do a lot of outreach work, but we are going to make those programs even more readily available. I thank our Chairman for always listening to me and for advising me and guiding the Board of Social Services in the right direction. Jim, you have a kind heart and a big heart and that is something I have learned over the many years working with you. Thank you for putting together these outreach programs that I envisioned, and you made a reality.

Last night I had the privilege of to hear the new Director of Homeward Bound. What a find. I know that Homeward Bound is in extremely good hands. A humbled, caring, extremely knowledgeable person is in the leadership role so thank you Commissioner Young for always looking out for our cats and dogs.

Commissioner Deputy Director McDonnell said I want to congratulate Al. I can't imagine how much work it was to bring the tournament to Camden County. Thank you. I would also like to congratulate Ginny, Dominic and Jim for the Board of Social Service move from the City to Cherry Hill. Another enormous undertaking. I have been down there and toured it and it is a fabulous job. Thank you to our employees who work so hard for our citizens.

Commissioner Director Cappelli said I too would like to thank our employees for the great work they do day in and day out for our residents.

The Director asked for a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Young made a motion with a second by Commissioner Betteridge and all Commissioners voted aye. The meeting was adjourned at 12:38 p.m.
